

4. As more fully set forth in the State's Petition, KMS was formed in 2018 as a Kansas corporation with a name similar to a well-known Kansas business and one of its indirect subsidiary corporations. KMS uses its name and its Kansas registered corporate status to masquerade as part of that Kansas business, in connection with counterfeiting activities in China. Thus, KMS is using its Kansas corporate status to impute false credibility to the counterfeiting activities of its affiliate in China.

5. On behalf of the State of Kansas, the Attorney General has the authority to seek to revoke or forfeit articles of incorporation for abuse or misuse of corporate powers, privileges, or franchises, pursuant to K.S.A. 17-6812(a).

Accordingly, it is hereby **ORDERED** that the State's Motion for Default Judgment is granted, and it is further **ORDERED** that the articles of incorporation of KMS shall be revoked and forfeited pursuant to K.S.A. 17-6812(a).
