## **Introduction**

The Kansas Legislature, in 1987, established the Crime Victims Reparations Board pursuant to K.S.A. 74-7301, et seq. recognizing that innocent victims of crime have been overlooked by the criminal justice system. In answer to the directive of the Legislature, the Crime Victims Reparations Board during its existence has made awards to 1,534 victims in Kansas for out-of-pocket medical expenses, loss of earnings or support, burial expenses and other costs associated with the treatment of their injuries, sustained as a result of being a victim of a violent crime. In its ten years of operation the Crime Victims Reparations Board has awarded a total of \$3,118,457.00 for payment of these losses because it was the last resort for the injured, innocent victim.

### **I. GENERAL PROGRAM INFORMATION**

The Crime Victims Reparations Board is appointed by the Governor and consists of three members: Charles M. Hart, Chairperson; Georgia Nesselrode, Member; and Carlos Cooper, Member.

There are three fulltime staff: the Executive Director, an Investigator, and a Secretary.

The Crime Victims Reparations Board provides funds to victims of criminally injurious conduct, or their dependents in cases of death, in the payment of medical care, rehabilitation, rehabilitative occupational training and other treatment and care if it is determined by the Board, after thorough investigation that the victim: (1) did not provoke the incident on which the claim is based; (2) the incident occurred in Kansas;

(3) the incident was reported to the proper law enforcement agency within 72 hours; (4) the application for reparations was filed within one year of the incident; (5) was not an accomplice to the incident; (6) economic loss totals more than \$100.00 and has not been recouped from other sources including collateral sources.

Work loss and dependent economic loss are limited to \$200.00 per week; expenses in any way related to funeral, cremation or burial are limited to \$750.00. Reparations payable to a victim or dependent may not exceed \$10,000.00. It is incumbent on the Board to verify that all information contained in the application is true and that the amounts requested are the responsibility of the claimant and a direct result of the incident on which the claim is based.

The Crime Victims Reparations Board has experienced a dramatic increase in claims filed every year since FY 1982. Claims filed have increased almost 30% each year, and while the average award per claim has fluctuated somewhat, the ratio of claims filed to awards paid has remained fairly constant at nearly 60%. Attorneys fees, as specified by statute, are paid only for assistance provided to the victim in preparation of a claim at the rate of \$45.00 per hour and are awarded in addition to the victim/claimant award.

It is important to note that the increase described above has occurred in the absence of any systematic information dissemination to publicize the reparations program. One explanation of this phenomena is that increased awareness among victims and service providers has expanded the public information network, resulting in more claims filed. Due to increasing

awareness among law enforcement agencies, rape crisis centers, victim/witness programs, domestic violence programs, and the public in general, a continued increase is projected.

In 1982 the Legislature assigned administration of the Rape Prevention and Crisis Intervention Services portion of the Federal Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant to the Crime Victims Reparations Board. The Crime Victims Reparations Board had available \$35,816.00 during fiscal year 1988. A total of \$34,816.00 was disbursed to local programs, statewide. The funds were used for continuation of sexual assault prevention programs for children and adults and to create or maintain rape crisis intervention hotlines. Thirteen programs received grants from this fund. (See Page 10)

K.S.A. 1984 Supp. 74-7325 established the Protection From Abuse Fund for the purpose of creating funds for programs providing services to victims of domestic abuse. The funding source established in this legislation is an \$8.00 fee assessment added to marriage license fees received in each county throughout the state. Monies deposited in the Protection from Abuse Fund are administered by the Crime Victims Reparations Board in the form of grants-in-aid.

In FY 88 a total of \$220,723.00 was available in the Protection From Abuse Fund and a total of \$170,584.00 was disbursed to domestic abuse programs statewide. The funds were used to assist funding the administration and operation of the following services within domestic abuse programs:

- (a) 24-hour crisis intervention;
- (b) shelter or safehouse facilities;
- (c) assistance and referral for victims; and
- (d) emergency transportation.

Sixteen programs received grants from this fund in FY 88. (See Page 11)

In June 1986 the Crime Victims Reparations Board applied for and received a grant from the U.S. Department of Health & Human Services under the Family Protection from Abuse Fund. \$104,356.00 was awarded during FY 88 as supplemental awards to fourteen domestic violence programs.

## **II. FUNDING OF REPARATIONS PROGRAM**

Prior to FY 83 the Crime Victims Reparations Board was solely funded by the State General Fund. During the 1982 Legislative session legislation was passed allowing the Crime Victims Reparations Board to receive an assessment of \$1.00 from each criminal court docket fee collected. The money received was to be deposited in the Crime Victims Reparations Fund and used solely for payment of reparations to victims. In order to meet the growing number of claims the 1985 Legislature increased to \$2.00 the court docket fee assessment earmarked for reparations. At the \$2.00 level receipts total approximately \$457,000.00 annually.

In FY 1986 the Crime Victims Reparations Board applied for and received, under the Victims of Crime Act of 1984, federal funds totaling \$116,000.00 to be used solely for payment of reparations (\$75,468.00 was expended in FY 86 and \$40,522.00 was carried forward into FY 87.) The FY

87 federal funds were not received until July 1987, hence the amount of \$131,000.00 was expended for payment of reparations during FY 88, together with the FY 88 federal funds received in June of 1988 in the amount of \$134,000.00. Consequently, federal funds in the total amount of \$265,000.00 were paid out in reparations during FY 88. Also during FY 86 the Legislature amended K.S.A. 74-7317 to allow moneys in the Crime Victims Reparations Fund to be used for state operations of the Crime Victims Reparations Board and eliminated the commitment from the State General Fund.

Therefore, the Crime Victims Reparations Board has evolved from an agency solely funded from the State General Fund to one solely funded from Special Revenue Funds including federal funds.

### **III. THE APPLICATION PROCESS FOR REPARATIONS**

The office receives numerous inquiries about eligibility for reparations. However, some inquiries are not processed by opening a file because it can be determined that the victim was not eligible under the statute. Many of ineligible inquiries concern automobile and property crimes which are excluded by the statute.

If the claim meets the eligibility requirements it is necessary to:

- 1) obtain a description of the incident from law enforcement reports to determine if any provocation by the victim is indicated and, if so, to contact any witnesses to the incident for their statements;
- 2) request any additional documentation which the claimant did not attach;



- 3) check with the respective District or County Attorney's office to determine if proceedings against the offender are imminent and if so to ask that restitution be considered at the time of sentencing;
- 4) verify the victim's relationship, if any, to the alleged offender;
- 5) consider other collateral sources reported as received by the claimant as a result of the incident; for example, Social Security, Worker's Compensation, private insurance, etc.
- 6) verify employment of the victim and/or the claimant in cases of wage loss or dependent economic loss;
- 7) verify the outstanding balances of hospital and doctor bills and their relevance to the claim; and
- 8) conduct a personal interview with the claimant regarding the information contained in the claim, and the involvement of the claimant in the circumstances surrounding the incident.

The Board is subrogated to the cause of the action of the applicant against the person responsible for the injury or death of the victim and also against the offender for the amount of damages sustained by the applicant.

#### **IV. STATUTORY HISTORY**

The Crime Victims Reparations Board (K.S.A. 74-7301 - 7318) was established by the Legislature in 1978 to alleviate the financial hardships caused by crime-related medical expenses and loss of income sustained by victims of violent crimes in Kansas. The Statute also provides that some payment can be made to dependents of deceased victims.

The 1982 Legislature, H.B. 3004, amended K.S.A. 74-7305(2)(g) which allowed rape victims to be awarded reparations even though their economic loss would be less than \$100.00.

K.S.A. 1984 Supp. 74-7325 established the Protection From Abuse Fund for the purpose of creating funds for programs providing services to victims of domestic abuse. The funding source established in this legislation is a \$8.00 fee assessment added to marriage license fees received in each county throughout the state. Monies deposited in the Protection from Abuse Fund are administered by the Crime Victims Reparations Board in the form of grants-in-aid.

K.S.A. 1984 Supp. 20-362 was revised by the 1985 Legislature with S.B. 108 which increased to \$2.00 a fee assessment collected from the costs of each docket fee of a criminal proceeding in any county. This money is deposited in the Crime Victims Reparations Fund established by the original docket fee assessment legislation by the 1982 Legislature, H. B. 3005.

K.S.A. 74-7302 was amended by the 1985 Legislature, S.B. 344 to read as follows: "Within the limits of appropriations therefor, the board shall award reparations for economic loss arising from criminally injurious conduct if satisfied by a preponderance of the evidence that the requirements for reparations have been met." The legislative intent of this amendment was to further clarify that the Crime Victims Reparations Board is not an entitlement program.

S.B. 685 passed by the 1986 Legislature amended K.S.A. 74-7317 to allow moneys in the Crime Victims Reparations Fund to be used for state

operations of the Crime Victims Reparations Board eliminating the commitment of the State General Fund. S.B. 685 also amended 74-7312 to allow moneys recovered by the Crime Victims Reparations Board through subrogation to be deposited into the Crime Victims Reparations Fund rather than the State General Fund.

S.B. 700 passed by the 1986 Legislature amended K.S.A. 74-7301(e) allowing victims of motor vehicle incidents involving DUI to be eligible to receive reparations for uninsured losses under the same restrictions and limitations imposed on victims of violent crimes. S.B. 700 also added New Section 2 to K.S.A. 74-7301 which requires that any profits from the sale of books, magazines, or other publications or from any movie, radio, television presentation or live entertainment regarding criminally accused or convicted person's (or their assignee's) thoughts, feelings, opinions, or emotions regarding the crime shall be paid to the Crime Victims Reparations Board. Any moneys received are to be deposited into an escrow account until distribution of funds can be determined as outlined in New Section 3.

K.S.A. 74-3701 was amended by the 1986 Legislature, S.B. 568 which provides specific language allowing the Crime Victims Reparations Board to apply for, receive and accept money from any source, including financial contributions from inmate worker wages thus allowing the State of Kansas to meet a mandatory certification requirement to participate in the Private Sector/Prison Industry Enhancement (PIE) Program administered by the Bureau of Justice Assistance of the U.S. Department of Justice.

## SUMMARY OF ILLUSTRATIVE CASES

### 9218-87

This 31 year old man was shot and killed while he was working at a gas station. He left a wife and two young children. The survivors will be receiving Worker's Compensation benefits and our Board approved the maximum funeral and burial allowance of \$750.00. The suspect was convicted of first degree murder.

### 9413-87

This 56 year old woman was attacked at her place of employment by a disgruntled client who inflicted very serious injuries to her head with his hands and his feet. She had to undergo extensive facial surgery for her fractures and subsequently required psychotherapy for severe anxiety, depression and flashbacks. A Worker's Compensation settlement covered most of her medical expenses; however, our Board did approve \$770.0 of out-of-pocket counseling, prescription drug and mileage expenses. The suspect was arrested and committed to a state security hospital.

### 10079-88

This 18 year old college student was shot while working out at a Wichita fitness center. He was taken by ambulance to a hospital where he died shortly thereafter. The suspect, who had entered the gym and randomly fired a .38 caliber revolver at the people inside, was apprehended and committed to a state security hospital. The Board approved the ambulance and hospital bills totaling \$1,991.10 and the maximum funeral and burial allowance of \$750.00.

### 9441-87

This 15 year old boy, whose mother applied on his behalf, was shot to death by the owner of a vehicle the youth was allegedly breaking into. The application for funeral benefits was denied on the basis of contributory misconduct.

### 10031-88

This 29 year old man was riding his bicycle down the sidewalk at night in a city when he was yelled at by some passerby in a car. When he stopped, two men got out of the car and hit him with a pipe. The suspect was arrested and subsequently pled guilty to aggravated battery. The Board approved \$463.00 for medical and dental expenses incurred.

### 10130-88

This 21 year old woman was at home studying in her upstairs bedroom late at night. She suddenly heard a noise outside the window and went to a roommate's room and awakened her. They heard further noises and called the police. The police arrived and did apprehend an intruder who was trying to break into the house. The woman applied for assistance with psychotherapy expenses due to emotional trauma she suffered from the incident. The Board, however, denied her claim on the basis that the incident did not fit the statutory definition of "criminally injurious conduct."

10101-88 and 10205-88

These 4 and 9 year old siblings were grocery shopping with several members of their family. They, with the permission of their mother, went into an adjoining discount store with instructions to return to the grocery section shortly. When the children did not return at the time instructed, the family searched for them. Unable to find them, they notified the police. A few hours later the children were located at another shopping center, miles away. They had been abducted by a strange male, sexually abused, and let off at this location. The Board approved counseling and medical expenses.

9429-87

This 31 year old woman was the victim of an attempted first degree murder by her husband. He instructed her to follow him in his car. He drove onto a country road and stopped. When she stopped behind him, he got out of his car and shot her in the head, leaving her for dead. The Board approved its maximum allowable award of \$10,000.00 towards her medical bills. Her husband was convicted and incarcerated.

10005-88

This 54 year old woman was asleep in her bedroom when she was awakened by a subject standing alongside her bed. He pulled the telephone from the wall, tied her wrists together with the cord and raped her. He fled through a window but was subsequently arrested and charged. The victim had some insurance coverage; however \$808.15 in medical and counseling expenses and \$4,738.39 in wage loss has been approved.

10004-88

This victim, a 34 year old woman, received extensive burns over her entire body when her boyfriend poured Everclear all over her and then set her jeans on fire with a cigarette lighter. She received skin grafts due to the seriousness of her burns. This victim did have some Medicaid coverage; however, the Board approved \$1,216.95 in medical expenses and \$1,177.00 in wage loss.

10070-88

This 67 year old woman was the victim of a battery and attempted rape. Fortunately, a noise scared the attacker off and there were no medical bills incurred. The claim was made for wage loss by the victim's son for time off work to aid in the police investigation. This claim was denied as the expenses claimed are not compensable under the crime victims statute.

10216-88

This 25 year old woman applied for assistance with funeral and counseling expense following the death of her 2 1/2 year old daughter at the hands of her stepfather. The stepfather committed suicide while in jail awaiting trial. The Board approved the maximum funeral allowance of \$750.00 and \$80.00 in counseling expenses.

10230-88

This 8 year old girl was the victim of indecent liberties by her uncle. The uncle has been charged with three counts of indecent liberties and is awaiting trial. The Board has approved \$408.50 in counseling expense to date.

10253-88

This 24 year old man was the victim of a very serious stab wound. Investigation by the police revealed that he, however, may well have been the initial aggressor in the incident. The Board also took into consideration the victim's blood alcohol level at the time, which was twice the legal limit for intoxication for driving a vehicle, when they denied the claim for reason of contributory misconduct.

10112-88

This 17 year old girl's mother applied on her behalf for counseling expenses after it was learned the girl's natural father had admitted to having sex with her approximately once a week for the past three years. The father was convicted of aggravated incest. The victim is receiving counseling at a reduced rate and the Board has approved expenses of just \$19.50 to date; however, the counseling will continue for some time.

10245-88

This 82 year old man was walking down the street at 6:00 p.m. on a summer evening when he was struck on the head from behind. He fell dazed to the ground and a subject grabbed his wallet and fled on foot. The suspect was subsequently identified and arrested and convicted of several such crimes. The Board approved \$104.89 of the hospital bill which was not covered by Medicare.
