#### INTRODUCTION

The Crime Victims Compensation Board (CVCB) was established by the Kansas Legislature in 1978 pursuant to K.A.S. 74-7301, et seq., to assist victims of violent crime. The CVCB completed its 16th year of operation on June 30, 1994. Since its inception, CVCB has made 5,249 awards to crime victims for a total of \$14,449,282. These awards cover out-of-pocket medical expenses, loss of earnings or support, burial expenses and other costs associated with the treatment of injuries sustained as a result of being a victim of a violent crime.

The Crime Victims Compensation Board is appointed by the Attorney General and consists of three members. During FY 1994 these members were C. William Ossmann, Topeka, Chair; Dorthy Stucky Halley, Pittsburg; and Carlos Cooper, Kansas City. There were also five full-time staff members; the Executive Director, two Investigators, one Secretary, one Keyboard Operator II and a part-time Office Assistant.

The 1989 Kansas Legislature recognized the inadequacy of funding for CVCB and changed the funding source to 19 percent of all fines, penalties and forfeitures received by the district court of each county. The Crime Victims Compensation fund also receives money from the Federal Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) of 1984. A total of \$2,189,000 has been received since 1986 from the federal VOCA and \$740,000 was utilized during FY 1994 for payment of compensation to crime victims.

In 1982 the CVCB administered the Federal Preventative Health and Health Services Block grant for Rape Prevention and Crisis Intervention Services. The CVCB distributed \$68,644 during FY 1994 to local and statewide programs. The funds were used for continuation of sexual assault prevention programs for children and adults and for creating and maintaining crisis intervention hotlines. Sixteen programs, including sexual assault centers and mental health centers, receive these funds.

The Kansas Legislature in 1984 created the Protection from Abuse Fund (K.S.A. 74-7325) for the purpose of providing financial assistance to domestic violence programs. assessment of \$8 was added to marriage license fees in In 1989 the Legislature increased the marriage license fee assessment to \$23. In FY 1994 a total of \$500,811 was disbursed to 22 domestic violence programs statewide. addition, a grant from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Family Violence Prevention and Services Fund, in the amount of \$177,589 was provided as supplemental awards to 22 domestic violence programs, including the Kansas Coalition Against Sexual and Domestic Violence. These funds are used to provide 24-hour crisis intervention, shelter and safehouse facilities, direct assistance for victims and their families, emergency transportation, etc.
