Greetings:

K.S.A. 75-7c16(b) of the Kansas Personal and Family Protection Act, also known as the concealed carry handgun law, requires the Attorney General, on or before January 1 of each year, to submit a statistical report to the Governor, President of the Senate, the Senate Minority Leader, the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the House Minority Leader indicating the number of concealed carry licenses issued, revoked, suspended and denied during the preceding fiscal year and the reasons for the revocations, suspensions and denials.

In Fiscal Year 2010, the Office of Attorney General issued 7,456 concealed carry handgun licenses. During the same period 90 applications were denied, 41 concealed carry licenses were suspended and 90 licenses were revoked.

4 – Denied for failure to meet 6-month residency requirement.

1 – Denied because the applicant failed to provide a training certificate.

1 – Denied because the applicant was under 21 years of age.

NOTE: 15 previously denied applicants reapplied after meeting requirements.

NOTE: 16 license revocations resulting from the issuance of temporary restraining orders, protection from abuse orders and protection from stalking orders were reinstated upon dismissal of the original orders.
